## \* Tom Box President of Box International Addresses American Institute Enterprise Regarding Reconstruction in Iraq and Afghanistan\*

The address included discussion of the challenges experienced by Box International in working to improve and rehabilitate the cement sectors in Iraq and Afghanistan from 2003 to 2006, and what can be done by both the U.S. Government and the private sector to achieve better coordination in obtaining more developmental progress and better results. "There is a great deal of interest in the U.S. Government to make significant advances in how infrastructure development and construction can be expedited and implemented, and to identify the mechanisms in which the public and private sector can responsibly increase coordination and efficiency to successfully address the challenges of a dynamic global community in a strategically relevant context," Tom Box said.

Policy priorities such as U.S. programs to counter act the effects of poverty and famine on developing countries were addressed, as well as the means to more efficiently implement long term strategic developmental initiatives that result in stimulating economic growth and development in transitional economies.
